

**Appointment Meeting**

K. Paul (Wakefield Chair) spoke about Fournier issue. Mr. Fournier had his own survey done. He used the company the state recommended. Do the towns want to spend a lot of money on doing the same survey?

M. Schwarz presented the aerial picture showing county line. J. Hotchkiss brought up, how many other people would be affected if the line was moved to accommodate Mr. Fournier. J. Hotchkiss stated that the Middleton Board is content on the ruling of the previous court hearing that ruled Mr. Fournier lived in Wakefield.

C. Edwards asked if the towns should do their own survey. He thinks we would end up paying the same survey group for the same information. Where do we go from here??? M. Schwarz states he has been considered a Wakefield resident for a long time. Why is Mr. Fournier persistent on being a Middleton resident? C. Edwards asked if we reset the pin (Pole) and the Mr. Fournier would be satisfied, the state will not come in and reset the marker.

J. Hotchkiss asked what the basis for going to court was last time. K. Paul stated that Mr. Fournier believes that his assessment would be lower in Middleton, but board thinks it's because of junk yard regulations.

J. Hotchkiss states that Middleton is basing their decision on the original court decision. He asked how many more residents would be affected if the line was moved.

In 2008 judge ordered Mr. Fournier lives in Wakefield since it was established that all his tax cards, registrations, etc. were all from Wakefield.

C. Edwards asked if we walked it again would it end this problem. No because they are not surveyors. The county should be declaring where the line is. He then states if we had it survey and the outcome was different from Mr. Fournier's survey, who's survey do we even go by??

M. Schwarz again states Middleton stands behind the original court decision. J. Bailey thinks they should contact the county and see if they can provide the lines. C. Edwards wants to let Mr. Fournier file his court papers again in Strafford County, and then maybe the county will determine the line.

J. Hotchkiss wants to know, how we would even measure road front footage if they have widened the road and there is no starting point.

M. Schwarz questioned if Mr. Fournier has permits from the Town of Wakefield, business or junkyard. K. Paul states he does not have either. M. Schwarz brought up DES concerns as well.

K. Paul put forward that both boards will now agree to stand by the original court judgment, and if there is a case filed, the board will get back together and discuss next steps.
